

Project Location



Purpose and Need


- Primary north-south corridor connecting Mendon Road and SR-23; functions as minor arterial.
- Route is routinely used by semi-trucks, farm equipment, and recreational and competitive cyclists.
- Roadway is showing extensive fatigue cracking.
- Requires ongoing crack and pothole maintenance.
- Shoulder degradation, drop-off, severe edge cracking.

Project Scope

- Reconstruct and rehabilitate 100 East Street from SR-23 to Center Street.
- Pulverize existing asphalt.
- Re-grade and re-establish cross-section.
- Widen sections to City Standards.
- Project is within existing rights-of-way.
- No underground utility work required.




Request for Funding

- Design: \$10,250
 - Construction Documents
 - Geotechnical Investigation
 - Survey
 - Construction Engineering
- Construction: \$199,900
- Contingency: \$10,600
- **Total Project Cost: \$220,750**
