
# Cache Valley Transit District (CVTD) FIRST & LAST MILE STUDY

## BACKGROUND

Cache County and the Cache Valley Transit District (CVTD) are initiating the CVTD First and Last Mile (FLM) Study. The analysis will identify strategies and solutions for getting people safely and conveniently to transit (first mile) and then to their final destination (last mile). FLM strategies will improve access to transit for multiple modes including pedestrians, bicycles, and personal vehicles. FLM strategies may also include methods for providing incentives to utilize transit over driving.

Cache County and CVTD selected the multidisciplinary team of Kimley-Horn to assist in the preparation of the study.

### **PROJECT GOALS**

The FLM study will recommend achievable and attainable strategies to improve multimodal access and remove barriers to CVTD facilities. It will also identify specific projects for each jurisdiction within the CVTD service area to demonstrate benefits to encourage additional future improvement investments. It will also define the roles and responsibilities for integrating these strategies into existing and future development.

### **PROJECT ACTIVITIES**

FLM Study project activities include the following:

- Engage the public and stakeholders to provide input to the study
- Conduct a literature review of established FLM strategies and best practices
- Summarize existing conditions and study area characteristics and applicable transit-related data
- Conduct field assessments
- Identify FLM improvement projects within each CVTD service area jurisdiction
- Provide implementation strategies and cost estimates for each improvement project.
- Host a FLM Summit attended by stakeholders
- Document findings in a Final Report
